The Navitas at UMass Boston program offers an alternative pathway to the University of Massachusetts Boston for international students who may not qualify for direct entry and who seek a supportive study environment.

The Navitas UPP is equivalent to the first year of a UMass Boston bachelor's degree program. When you successfully complete Year 1 with Navitas you can move directly into the second year of your undergraduate degree.

All students entering the program are fully matriculated UMass Boston students from day one with Navitas.
