Psychology Major

A psychology major may choose to pursue either a BA or a BS degree. The two tracks are similar, but the BS includes additional work in the natural sciences.

Social Psychology Major

The Psychology and Sociology Departments offer a joint major in Social Psychology. Students who select this major complete a complementary sequence of psychology and sociology courses, and also have access to advising and counseling from both departments.

Minors and Interdisciplinary Programs

Psychology offers a minor in Psychology and an interdisciplinary minor in Cognitive Science, in collaboration with Computer Science. There is also an interdisciplinary Program in Biobehavioral Studies and Organizational Behavior.
